# Introduction

“*Say and Do*”<sup>®</sup> *Auditory Lessons* is a collection of auditory activities to help your students practice their auditory processing skills. Each lesson targets a specific auditory processing area and has two levels—*Level One* for beginning practice and *Level Two* for advanced practice. The activities contained in “*Say and Do*”<sup>®</sup> *Auditory Lessons* allow the students to focus on a particular auditory skill with increasing difficulty. Depending on the students’ skill levels, begin with *Level One* lessons and progress to *Level Two* lessons. (For example, *Level One Rhyming* contains one-syllable words and *Level Two Rhyming* contains two-syllable words.) The listening tasks work well with individual or group sessions. The lessons may also be sent home for carryover. As your students master an auditory processing skill, encourage them to practice those skills in their daily routines. You may also want to use the lessons to meet IEP and treatment goal objectives.
