Sometimes Big Red snuck up behind Little Bitty and pulled his tail.

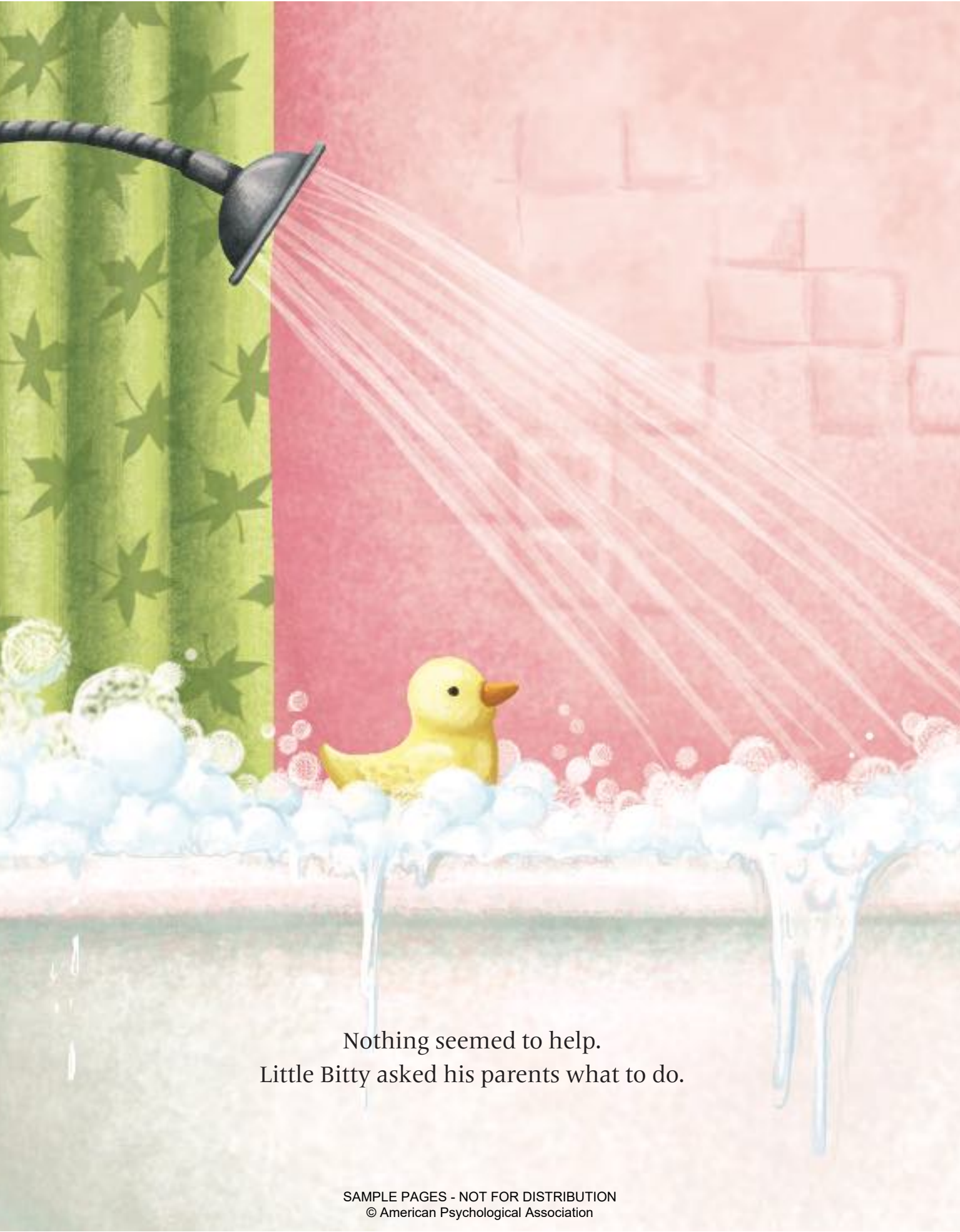


Little Bitty tried not to whine.
