 Yesterday, you beat the batter.

 9. **were beating** You were beating the batter.
 10. **had beaten** Earlier, Susan had beaten the batter.
 Earlier, you had beaten the batter.

11. **will beat** Susan will beat the batter.
 You will beat the batter.

Sally is blowing bubbles.

4. **are blowing**

They are blowing bubbles.

Present Perfect

5. **has blown**

Sally has blown bubbles.

6. **have blown**

They have blown bubbles.

7. **blew**

Yesterday, Sally blew bubbles.

Yesterday, they blew bubbles.

Past Progressive

8. **was blowing**

Sally was blowing bubbles.

9. **were blowing**

They were blowing bubbles.

Past Perfect

10. **had blown**

Earlier, Sally had blown bubbles.

Earlier, they had blown bubbles.

11. **will blow**

Sally will blow bubbles.

They will blow bubbles.

1. **eats** Tracy eats a sandwich.
2. **eat** They eat a sandwich.
3. **is eating** Tracy is eating a sandwich.
4. **are eating** They are eating a sandwich.
5. **has eaten** Tracy has eaten a sandwich.
6. **have eaten** They have eaten a sandwich.

7. **ate** Yesterday, Tracy ate a sandwich.
Yesterday, they ate a sandwich.

7. **met** Yesterday, Bella met the other team.
Yesterday, they met the other team.
8. **was meeting** Bella was meeting the other team.
9. **were meeting** They were meeting the other team.
10. **had met** Earlier, Bella had met the other team.
Earlier, they had met the other team.

Future

11. **will meet** Bella will meet the other team.
They will meet the other team.
