

Armadillos are from South America. They can also be found in the southern United States. *Armadillo* is a Spanish word. It means "man in **armor**." Armadillos' shells are like armor. Armor is tough, bony plates. They protect soft muscles and tissues.

Armadillos' shells cover the top of their bodies. Top shells are called **carapaces**. They're strong. Dogs' sharp teeth can't cut their shells. These shells are their main defense. When in danger, they hide in their shells. They wait. Most predators get bored.



Most armadillos cannot roll into a ball. They have too many plates. But three-banded armadillos can. They fold their bodies. They hide all their body parts.
