

Zombie Ants Lose Their Heads

When an adult phorid fly buzzes near a group of red fire ants, the ants scatter. Some ants run away while others snap their jaws at the fly as she hovers above them. / Suddenly the fly drops onto an ant, jabs a stinger-like barb into it, and injects an egg. The fly zips away, and soon the egg hatches a tiny maggot inside the ant. / The maggot releases a drug into the ant's brain that makes the ant crawl away from its nest to a pile of moist leaves. Then the maggot moves into the fire ant's head, killing it. / Soon the ant's head falls off its body with the growing maggot inside. Weeks later, a young phorid fly breaks out of the ant's head and flies away to look for more fire ants.
