Sounds: -ang, -ank -ing, -ink; h-digraphs; -ck; -zz, -ll, -ff, -ss; all short vowels

Suffixes: -s, -cs, -ing

High frequency words: out, could, here would, some, like(s), again, should, because (see full list of Level One and Two sight words at www.whole-phonics.com)

Contractions: what's he's, let's, don't, can't, it's

Compound words: onto into

Special vocabulary: fang, "bums her out," yank(s), sank onto, put off

Summary:

Siss introduces her cousin Hank to her friends. His long fangs scare the kids. How will Hank and Siss convince the kids that Hank is a friend?

Reading comprehension questions:

- 1. What does Hank suggest to make Siss happy?
- 2. How does Mel help Hank?
- 3. Do any animals scare you? What do you do to not feel afraid?
